PRODUCTION NOTES

SLIDERS, the ambitious new science fiction adventure series from MCA TV International is about four explorers who discover a gateway to travelling to parallel universes.

SLIDERS asks the perennial question "what if" and chronicles the adventures of pioneers who have figured out how to "slide" through parallel dimensions of Earth, experiencing and exploring Earth today as it would be if a different path had been taken, personally or historically. So though it's always Earth today, the group encounters a different "what if" scenario each time they "slide" into parallel dimensions.

The eclectic group of travelers includes: **Quinn Mallory** (Jerry O'Connell, "My Secret Identity," "Stand By Me") – a young genius who finds the key to "sliding" travel from a homemade laboratory in his basement; **Professor Maximillian Arturo** (John Rhys-Davies, "Raiders of the Lost Ark," "Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade") – Quinn's traditional professor who reluctantly acknowledges his student's brilliance and goes along for the scientific ride of his life; **Rembrandt "Crying Man" Brown** (Cleavant Derricks, "Dreamgirls") – a member of the classic singing group "The Spinning Tops" and is known for crying real tears at every performance, is unwittingly caught in the momentum of the initial "slide" on his way to sing the national anthem at a local sports event; and **Wade Wells** (Sabrina Lloyd, "Chain of Desire") – A computer technician and Quinn's good friend whose unrequited love is a source of tension between them.

SLIDERS - Production Notes

Some of the scenarios the group encounters while travelling to parallel dimensions include:

- A world where traditional male and female roles are reversed;
- A world where Albert Einstein withheld the secret to nuclear energy, and with no atomic weapons, it is impossible to destroy an asteroid on a collision course with Earth;
- A world where antibiotics are unknown and a bacterial disease running rampant has caused an incurable epidemic; and
- A world where America lost the Revolutionary War and the United States of America is the British States of America.

Robert K. Weiss serves as co-creator/executive producer, whose film credits include the three "Naked Gun" movies, "Dragnet," "The Blues Brothers" and "Kentucky Fried Movie." For television he produced "Police Squad," the predecessor for the "Naked Gun" film series. Emmy-nominated Tracy Torme serves as co-creator and co-executive producer for the series. He began his career as a staff writer for the much acclaimed Second City Television before becoming a writer/filmmaker for "Saturday Night Live." From there he joined the writing staff of "Star Trek: The Next Generation" and also served as writer/producer on the Emmy-nominated mini-series "Intruders." Torme is the only writer to have won a Peabody Award for one-hour television drama ("Star Trek: The Next Generation").

Rhys-Davies is best known to film audiences for his roles in such blockbuster hits as "Raiders of the Lost Ark" and "Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade." He has also had leading roles in "Victor, Victoria," "The Living Daylights" and "King Solomon's Mine."

His television credits include such well-received mini-series as James Clavell's "Shogun" and "Noble House," "Great Expectations," "War and Remembrance" and "Archaeology."

Rhys-Davies, who was raised in England, Africa and Wales, credits his early exposure to classic literature for his decision to pursue acting and writing. He refined his craft at London's renowned Royal Academy of Dramatic Arts and has a host of theatre roles to his credit, including "The Misanthrope," "Hedda Gabler" and most of Shakespeare's works.

An avid collector of vintage automobiles, Rhys-Davies divides his time between Los Angeles and the Isle of Man.

A graduate of Southern Illinois University, Weiss currently resides in California. He is a member of the Directors Guild of America.

Tracy Torme is both co-creator and co-executive producer of MCA TV International's science fiction adventure series **SLIDERS**.

Torme began his career before his senior year of college, when he was hired as a staff writer for the much acclaimed Second City Television. From there he joined "Saturday Night Live" as a writer and filmmaker before becoming a member of the writing staff of "Star Trek: The Next Generation." It was in this role that he won a Peabody Award for writing one of the series' best-received episodes, "The Big Good-bye." Torme also served as writer and producer on the Emmy-nominated mini-series, "Intruders."

In addition to his many television credits, Torme wrote the screenplay for the 1993 film, "Fire in the Sky," which he also co-produced.

Torme is presently developing "Dark City," a 90-minute pilot for cable, while simultaneously working on the script for a film based on Richard Matheson's classic novel, "I Am Legend," which he will also produce.

Torme currently resides in Los Angeles.

Leslie Belzberg, Executive Producer

Leslie serves as executive producer of MCA TV International's science fiction adventure series **SLIDERS**.

Born in Calgary, Canada, Leslie graduated from York University in Toronto with a degree in English Literature and Contemporary Drama. She moved to New York City where she received a degree from Fordham University before joining the Simon Wiesenthal Center as a non-profit fundraiser. When her job with the Center required a transfer to Los Angeles, Belzberg had no idea that it would ultimately generate a career change.

Belzberg's introduction to filmmaking came through a documentary "Genocide," which the Center was producing. When the film was expanded to feature length, she became involved in the post-production and was named associate producer of the film which went on to win the 1981 Academy Award for Best Documentary Feature.

The fledgling producer entered the film industry when George Folsey, Jr. hired her to work with him and John Landis on "Trading Places." She subsequently teamed with the producer and director as associate producer of the films "Spies Like Us," "Three Amigos" and "Into the Night." Belzberg was the executive producer on the Landis/Folsey comedy

Young genius Quinn Mallory discovers the means to travelling to parallel dimensions of Earth via a portal wormhole he creates in his basement laboratory. Quinn's physics teacher, Professor Maximillian Arturo, and his friend Wade Wells visit Quinn at home, and together they decide to travel into the next dimension of Earth. When the threesome start up the wormhole's energy for the journey, the strength of it accidentally inhales Rembrandt Brown, a washed-up Rhythm & Blues singer en route to Candlestick Park in San Francisco to sing the National Anthem, who happens to drive by Quinn's house. The four "sliders" travel first to a San Francisco submerged under ice and then to a San Francisco ruled by the Soviets. After experiencing these dimensions of Earth, the sliders try to return to their original world, only to discover that they can't, in MCA TV International's pilot episode of SLIDERS.

Quinn Mallory, a 25-year-old physics graduate student, establishes himself as the genius who is desperately searching for the answer to the "Holy Grail of Physics" - travel to parallel dimensions of the same Earth. In his homemade laboratory in the basement of his house, Quinn has created a wormhole portal and timer by which to travel. In an attempt to find an answer to this mystery, he sends objects such as a paper airplane, a Rubic's Cube and a basketball into the void. Aching to learn more, however, Quinn vows to transport himself via the wormhole into another dimension for fifteen minutes - and travels to a world where red street lights mean "go," green street lights mean "stop," Elvis Presley performs live in Las Vegas and Ronald Reagan is the mayor of San Francisco.

After fifteen minutes Quinn is transported back to his dimension of Earth. Excited about his experience, he runs to his physics class and begins to explain his travels to Professor Maximillian Arturo, who interrupts Quinn because of how he had supposedly behaved in his class. Confused, Quinn leaves and drives to his afternoon job at a computer store - only to discover that he's been fired just hours before for being disrespectful to his condescending employer.

Quinn returns home to his basement laboratory and is surprised at what he discovers - the answer to his physics equation regarding dimension travel is written on his chalkboard! Suddenly, "Quinn #2" emerges from the shadows, to explain that he, too, is Quinn Mallory, only from another dimension. After a chat about his "sliding" travels, "Quinn #2" leaves and tries to warn Quinn about something, but is taken into the vortex too quickly to finish his sentence.

Excited by what he's just learned, Quinn contacts his friend Wade Wells and Professor Arturo and asks them to visit. Upon hearing Quinn's explanation, Wade can't wait to travel "the galaxy." Professor Arturo, overcome with awe that his student has discovered the gateway to other dimensions, decides that he too must accompany Quinn and Wade on their "joy ride." Quinn sets the timer for four hours and turns up the power on the timer, but so much so that the portal wormhole inhales an innocent by-stander - Rembrandt Brown, a washed-up singer who happens to drive by Quinn's house en-route route to Candlestick Park where he's scheduled to sing the National Anthem at a baseball game.

Spinning upside-down, through a colorful channel of lights, the "sliders" land in San Francisco, two-thirds of which is submerged in ice. When a nearby ice tornado threatens to swallow them, Quinn ignores the timer, which reads that the sliders must stay in this iceland for another four hours, and creates the portal to transport them from this world. The world it takes them to, however, is not their dimension - rather, it's modern day San Francisco ruled by the Soviets, who apparently won the Cold War in the 1960s.

When Rembrandt is taken prisoner for paying a cabdriver with money that is considered to be the trademark of the underground revolutionaries, Quinn, Wade and Professor Arturo join forces with the revolutionaries to free him by taking control of the prison where police have incarcerated him. Successful in their effort, but narrowly escaping death in the process, the sliders jump into the portal and travel back to their dimension of Earth - or so they think.

The sliders travel to a parallel world where Oliver North is President, the U.S. is involved in a bitter Civil War in Australia and hippies from the 1960's roam the streets of San Francisco, while Rembrandt finds out he would have lived in misery as a hen-pecked husband if he married his childhood sweetheart in MCA TV International's SLIDERS episode entitled "Summer of Love."

The travelers first slide to a parallel world about to be overtaken by poisonous insects and they barely escape to a new world where San Francisco is still inhabited by hippies from the 1960's - except now, Oliver North is President, the U.S. is involved in a Vietnam-type war in Australia and the flower children are under surveillance by the police.

The timer is turned and the group is separated by the slide, so Quinn and Arturo take up residence in a low-rent apartment and go to work to repair the apparatus. Meanwhile, Rembrandt and Wade are taken-in by hippies who worship their every move. But when Rembrandt goes on a scouting expedition, he stumbles upon his own funeral and sees the life that might have been had he married his childhood sweetheart, Sharon. After a night of wild sex, he soon realizes it would have been a mistake since Sharon overpowers him into subordination. He also sees that he has a son, who has a bad attitude.

The four sliders are miraculously reunited, and Quinn and Arturo figure out a way to repair the timer, but they are now at its mercy because after each slide, a designated time will appear until the next gate opens. With the police right behind them, Quinn activates the timer and they slip into the gate, only to find themselves in a parallel world about to be overtaken by a tidal wave.

The sliders escape from a parallel world about to be engulfed by a tidal wave, and find themselves in a world where England won the Revolution and the United States of America is the British States of America.

Arturo is aghast when he discovers that his double in this dimension is the Sheriff of San Francisco who has devised a malicious plot to kill Crown Prince Harold, who has no heirs, so his demise would mean the end of the monarchy. Quinn befriends the Oakland Raiders (a group of rebels) who want the Prince as hostage, yet he's able to expose the Sheriff's ulterior motives and introduces to the Prince the concept of democracy, which ultimately preserves his status.

The sliders find themselves in paradise but they must slide on to a parallel earth where antibiotics were never discovered, and a raging bacterial infection threatens to wipe out the population in MCA TV International's SLIDERS episode entitled "Fever."

The sliders' first stop is a paradise parallel earth, where oil has been discovered and money flows through the streets of San Francisco. But they must move on, and this time they are in a disease-ravaged environment with no medicine to cure the Q virus. They discover that Quinn, in this dimension, is "patient zero" and the origin of this deadly epidemic. When Wade becomes ill, Arturo, also a victim, realizes that the disease is spreading because antibiotics have never been discovered. Using very elementary ingredients, he creates a very primitive form of penicillin, which he tests on himself. When that works, he is able to give the cure to the diseased, and the sliders are able to escape to their next destination before being captured by the disease control authorities.

With only 48 hours until "Dooms Day" (and 72 hours until the next slide), Arturo works feverishly with Bennish, an eccentric, yet brilliant young scientist, to recreate Einstein's equation for the atomic bomb. However, when his notes drop out of his pocket while celebrating a successful mission, Bennish picks them up, knowing he has all the power in the world.
